Take the Crosstown Freeway to Interstate 5 and head north to March Lane.

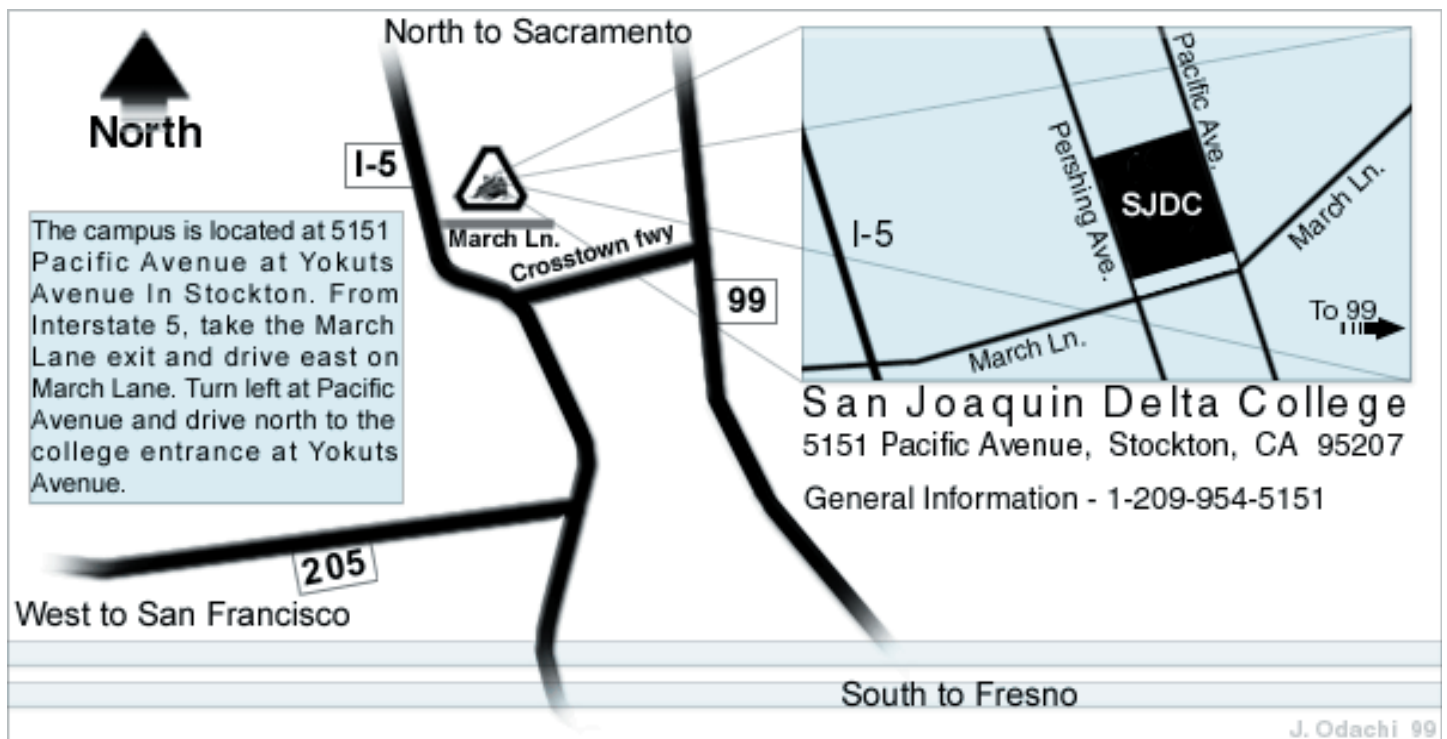
From the San Francisco Bay Area
